Odorless Paint thinner (<u>Sunnyside</u>) <u>ONLY</u> I will bring extra cans for anyone who can't find it. Costs about 9.00 Qt. plus tax. Bring med. size jar with lid (preferably with screen on bottom for wiping/cleaning brushes) <u>Note:</u> I have found this thinner to be the most tolerable for painters, lowest odor, and no allergic reactions. Cobalt Blue, Ultramarine Blue, Cerulean Blue, Cobalt Violet Cadmium Yellow Light, Yellow Ochre, New Gamboges, Naples Yellow Rose Madder or Permanent Rose (* a red with Quinacridone in it), Cadmium Red Light Olive Green, "Thalo" or Viridian Green, Davy's Gray, Burnt Sienna, Raw Umber

Other Supplies:

#6 and #10 round brushes and a #36 round or a 1" flat brush, a synthetic sponge 140 # stretched W. C. Paper or 300# paper or a W. C. Block
*(please soak and stretch 140 # (or less) paper onto a gator board or homasote. Do NOT TAPE IT DOWN). Suggested sizes to work on: 8" x 10", 9" x 12", 12" x 20"
Sketchbook, kneaded eraser, a 4H pencil for value studies, a W.C. Easel or some type of surface to paint on, paper towels.
